Maryland Women's Business Center

MWBC helps entrepreneurs start, sustain, and grow successful women-owned enterprises. To position businesses for profitability and long-term growth, we offer year-round training, counseling, access to resources and funding.



US Small Business Administration

Maryland Department of Commerce

University of Maryland at College Park

The University of Maryland is part of the University System of Maryland and houses the MIPs program and other research and development resources to support small businesses. The University also has related business incubator programs and supports the local WeWork co-working space.

Bowie State University
